time on the clock of 9:37. I'm
going to call to order today special meeting Town of Hempstead IDA. This is the Park Lake Project Hempstead LP. We had a public hearing on Monday, May $10 t h . \quad$ ''m going to take attendance.

Mr. Johnson?
Mr. Oppenheimer? Aye.
CHAIRMAN GIRARDI: MS.

Hargraves?

MS. HARGRAVES: Present.

CHAIRMAN GIRARDI: MS.

Williams?

MS. WILLIAMS: Present.

CHAIRMAN GIRARDI: MS.

Vanderhall?

Reverend Mallette.

REVEREND MALLETTE: Here.

CHAIRMAN GIRARDI: Mr. Marsh?

MR. MARSH: Present.

CHAIRMAN GIRARDI: Mr. Majkut?
MR. MAJKUT: Present.

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CHAIRMAN GIRARDI: Mr. Bedford?
Flo Girardi is present.
The only item on the agenda is
Park Lake Hempstead.
Does somebody want to make a motion?

MR. MARSH: Yes. This is James Marsh. I'd like to make a motion that this be tabled to our next meeting, our next regular meeting. We only got the transcript of the public hearing late yesterday afternoon. I, for one, did not have the time to give it the attention that it no doubt deserves so I'd like to waive that this matter be put over to our next meeting. CHAIRMAN GIRARDI: Do I get a second?

MR. PAROLA: No seconds.
CHAIRMAN GIRARDI: Do I get a motion to move ahead?

MR. RYAN: You don't need a motion to move ahead. You can move
ahead with the business.

CHAIRMAN GIRARDI: In the matter of Park Lake, I'm going to take a vote.

Mr. Johnson?

Mr. Oppenheimer?
MR. OPPENHEIMER: Aye.

CHAIRMAN GIRARDI: Mr. Johnson is on?

MR. RYAN: Before you take the vote, $I$ think you need someone to move it and to second it.

CHAIRMAN GIRARDI: That's what I asked and you said we don't need it.

MR. RYAN: No, I didn't mean
that. I meant the motion by Mr. Marsh to table.

CHAIRMAN GIRARDI: What motion do we have to move, Mr. Ryan, not to table or to make a motion?

MR. RYAN: The motion to table failed. You can now proceed with considering the Park Lake

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application and entertain a motion on that application.

CHAIRMAN GIRARDI: So I need somebody then to make a motion for Park Lake. Does anybody want to make a motion?

MR. MAJKUT: I'll make the motion.

MS. HARGRAVES: I second.
CHAIRMAN GIRARDI: Is that Ms. Hargraves?

MS. HARGRAVES: Yes.
CHAIRMAN GIRARDI: I'll take a vote.

Mr. Johnson?
Mr. Oppenheimer?
MR. OPPENHEIMER: Aye.
CHAIRMAN GIRARDI: MS.

Hargraves?
MS. HARGRAVES: Aye.
CHAIRMAN GIRARDI: Ms.
Williams?

MS. WILLIAMS: Aye.
CHAIRMAN GIRARDI: MS.
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Vanderhall?
Reverend Mallette?

REVEREND MALLETTE: Aye.
CHAIRMAN GIRARDI: I'm an aye.
REVEREND MALLETTE: To proceed with the vote, right?

MR. MARSH: No, no. Are we proceeding with the vote or on the motion to approve this application? Let's be clear.

CHAIRMAN GIRARDI: This is the vote. Does everybody understand that this is the vote?

REVEREND MALLETTE: NO, I
didn't understand that. I thought we were taking a motion to proceed with the agenda.

CHAIRMAN GIRARDI: The motion was presented and it was seconded so now we're taking the vote.

REVEREND MALLETTE: So this is
the vote on the Park Lake
application?
CHAIRMAN GIRARDI: Yes.

REVEREND MALLETTE: I vote no.

CHAIRMAN GIRARDI: I'm going to start from the beginning in case anybody else was confused.

REVEREND MALLETTE: Thank you.
CHAIRMAN GIRARDI: Mr. Johnson
who didn't answer the roll call?
Mr. Oppenheimer?

MR. OPPENHEIMER: Aye.
CHAIRMAN GIRARDI: MS.

Hargraves?
MS. HARGRAVES: Aye.
CHAIRMAN GIRARDI: MS.

Williams?

MS. WILLIAMS: Aye.

CHAIRMAN GIRARDI: MS.

Vanderhall?

Reverend Mallette?

REVEREND MALLETTE: No.

CHAIRMAN GIRARDI: Mr. Marsh?

MR. MARSH: No. And I want on
the record that I'm voting against
this because I see very little benefit going to the tenants of this

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project. I see a great benefit
going to current owners of the
project. I see a substantial
developer's fee going to the party
who is now the applicant. This is
all going to be paid for on the backs of the taxpayers of the Town of Hempstead so $I$ vote no as we did the last time.

CHAIRMAN GIRARDI: Okay.
Mr. Majkut?
MR. MAJKUT: Aye.
CHAIRMAN GIRARDI: Mr. Bedford?
Mr. Grech?
MR. GRECH: No.
CHAIRMAN GIRARDI: Flo Girardi is a no as well. Four ayes and four nays.

Mr. Ryan, we have 11 people on
the board including the Village.
How many votes do you need to pass?
You need six to pass?
MR. RYAN: Yes.
MR. DEEGAN: Mr. Chairman, this
is Dan Deegan, the attorney for the applicant. Can $I$ be heard for a minute?

CHAIRMAN GIRARDI: We don't have any --

MR. MARSH: I don't see any reason to proceed with this any further. I'll make a motion to adjourn the meeting.

MR. DEEGAN: Mr. Chairman, this
is Dan Deegan. Can $I$ be heard?

CHAIRMAN GIRARDI: I'll give you two minutes.

MR. DEEGAN: So this is an opportunity, this is a tremendous opportunity, if we do not pass this today. These tenants are living in a condition that is less than ideal and this is an opportunity to completely gut renovate the entire place. The next 10 years are staying the same no matter what the IDA does in terms of PILOT. There is already a PILOT in place. What
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we're talking about is a 15 year extension on similar grounds which will make available tremendous amount of money to renovate these apartments. This is affecting real people, a thousand people living there, at really no cost to the Village. This property has always been there. I understand that the mayor and new administration are a hundred percent in favor of this. We've had meetings with the school district. We've been told that they are in favor of this. It's obviously an excellent project. That being said, my understanding was the mayor was going to be, I'm not sure if he's on the line. I don't know if we can put this off to when this, you know obviously, if it's fought for, we can have another vote on another date when everybody can participate. I don't want to see this go down and
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have this really -- I'm being really
heartfelt here. This is going to affect families and children, this vote. This renovation will not take place, it cannot financially take place without this vote of the IDA. If we're not going to do it today, I'd rather put it off to another date.

CHAIRMAN GIRARDI: Mr. Deegan,
I guess you can discuss that with staff.

I'm going to make a motion to adjourn today's meeting.

MR. MARSH: Second the motion.

CHAIRMAN GIRARDI: Mr.
Oppenheimer?
MR. OPPENHEIMER: No.

CHAIRMAN GIRARDI: MS.

Hargraves?
MS. HARGRAVES: Adjourn the
meeting? What exactly are we voting on right now, adjourning the meeting? If we don't adjourn it,
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what are the repercussions?
MR. PAROLA: It stays open.
CHAIRMAN GIRARDI: I'll make a motion to adjourn the meeting. It was seconded. We're taking a vote to adjourn it.

MS. VANDERHALL: Then we can do another vote?

CHAIRMAN GIRARDI: Another day, yes.

MR. MARSH: How many times does a losing proposition have to be presented before people accept that it's losing? There is not a benefit for the tenants. I asked to find out exactly what each tenant is going to get and $I$ haven't got --

MR. DEEGAN: Mr. Marsh, that is outrageous for you to say that. That is just wrong. You don't know what you're talking about.

MR. MARSH: I know what I'm
talking about. You're trying to save your client's position. That's
all.
CHAIRMAN GIRARDI: Gentlemen, there is motion to adjourn. We're doing the vote on that right now.

MR. GRESH: I would second the motion to adjourn as long as we can review this again at a later date.

MR. PAROLA: The motion should be to table.

CHAIRMAN GIRARDI: I'll
withdraw the motion $I$ made to
adjourn. I'll make a motion to
table the Park Lake project.
MR. GRESH: I will second it.
REVEREND MALLETTE: We already
entertained that and it wasn't
seconded by Mr. Marsh in the beginning.

CHAIRMAN GIRARDI: That's correct.

MR. PAROLA: It's been reconsidered.

CHAIRMAN GIRARDI: We're shy Mr. Johnson, Ms. Vanderhall and

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Mr. Bedford.

MS. LONGO: Gentlemen, the stenographer is going to have a very hard time getting all this. Everybody is talking over each other. Nobody is announcing themselves so the record is not going to be accurate because we're all over the place. Everybody just take a pause for a minute if they can so you can then introduce whatever it is that we're going to introduce so the stenographer can get them.

MR. MARSH: We already have a motion on the table that has been seconded to adjourn the meeting. MR. PAROLA: That's been withdrawn. The motion now is to table.
